We're a group of individuals: scholars, academics, students, and others, devoted to the study, analysis, interpretation, and wonders of the evidence of manuscripts and related materials of many periods, their origins, provenance, history, and legacy.

We started out as a small scholarly society based in England at Corpus Christi College in the University of Cambridge, from where we originated various seminars, workshops, and conference sessions on various topics, before moving our principal base to the United States in 1994 and incorporating the RGME in 1999. With the move, our interests, subjects, and research have widened, to embrace many periods and forms of material evidence, but we have continued to hold events in England on occasion.

We have always maintained our independence, without permanent affiliation to any specific institution. This position allows us to encourage a wide range of participants, covering many disciplines, interests, and perspectives. We have our own multi-lingual digital font **Bembino** to support a growing suite of languages (Western and beyond), in response to requests. (The newest request brings Elvish to **Bembino**.)
