Here, by virtual curated visits, we can meet collections, collectors, curators, scholars, teachers, students, and others engaged in learning from the evidence of manuscripts, printed books, coins, photographs, and other media — not forgetting facsimiles, surrogates, and simulacra which can represent originals lost, distant, or imagined.

Our virtual guided tours will visit collections and initiatives in the company of their curators, scholars, collectors, practitioners, and devotees. They include some private collections and the libraries of University of Missouri–Columbia, Vassar College, Princeton University, the University of Waterloo, and the University of Delaware, where the Symposium visits the Collection of Mark Samuels Lasner.
