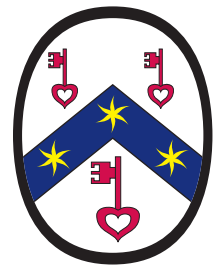

Narratives (both real and imagined) have their part in the story, as do illustrations or embodiments of events and inscriptions in a variety of media. We examine the issues of fragments dispersed from former whole objects, or groups of objects, and the powers of reconstructing their characters through detection, research, and developments by many methods, digital included.

Our sessions will focus on predicaments, challenges and opportunities. For example, we celebrate recent researches and discoveries among the manuscript remnants from the collection of Otto F. Ege.
